Dear Parent/Carer,

This week in Literacy, we have been learning the sounds i, n, m and d. We have also blended to read and segmented to spell words such as: sat, pin, tin, pan, and nip. We will continue to learn our sounds next week. Please find attached to this newsletter the sounds that we have learnt so far. The children are doing very well learning their sounds; please keep practising them at home. They need to become confident at instantly recognising the letter shape and being able to say the sound that it makes e.g., s = "sssss" not "suh." We have been learning how to form the letters 's; and 'a' which can be found on your child's handwriting sheets. Each week, two new sounds will be added inside for them to practise forming the letters at home.

In Numeracy this week, we have been sorting objects into sets. We have introduced the word 'sorting' and learnt that collections of objects can be sorted based on attributes including colour, size or shape. Next week, we will be comparing, sorting and ordering different sizes from small to big or shorter to taller etc.

In our topic work this week, we have been looking at our family photographs and talking about what we like to do when we are with our families. Thank you for all the family photographs that have been sent into school which has really helped to enhance our learning this week. We have also introduced the Oxford Reading Tree (ORT) characters: Kipper, Biff, Chip, Mum and Dad and the children should be able to tell you something about them. These characters appear in some of our shared, whole class story books which we use to develop comprehension skills. Many of the stories can be found as ebooks on the Oxford Reading Tree website www.oxfordowl.co.uk

We hope you are enjoying receiving all the updates on Seesaw that have been uploaded so far. Please keep looking at your child's Seesaw profile as this will be regularly updated with observations, achievements and next steps for their learning which they can work on at home.




