Dear Parents/Carers,


In Literacy this week, we have been focusing on spelling the phase 3 tricky words. We have talked about how we can't use our segmenting fingers to spell these words and that we just need to know them. We practised reading the tricky words and then covered them up to practise spelling them. We are also focusing on keeping our writing small and neat and sitting the letters on the line. Please help your child to recognise them instantly and to practise the spelling of these words too. This week we have been practising forming the trigraphs 'ear' and 'air.'






In Numeracy, we have been learning all about sharing and grouping and used our knowledge or equal and unequal groups to support us. We asked key questions such as 'How many are there in each group?' 'How many do you have?' 'Are the groups equal?' 'How do you know?' We have also been busy consolidating our learning of making and finding doubles and asked key questions such as 'What is a double?' 'How can you show me a double?'





As part of our enquiry learning this week, we have been learning all about the different amazing animals and learnt about how they make adaptations to survive in the wild and how they are similar and different to animals that live in captivity. We have enjoyed making our favourite amazing animals using various media and materials. Next week in enquiry learning we will be learning all about Father's Day and why some people celebrate this special day.
