## **Reception Newsletter**

Dear Parents/Carers,

In Literacy this week, we have been practising spelling and writing words containing the two and three letter sounds. We have also been writing captions and sentences remembering to use a capital letter at the beginning, finger spaces between each word and a full stop at the end. We have enjoyed ready our class reader 'The Gingerbread Man.' We made our very own Gingerbread Man and put him in the oven to cook. When we went to check on him and were very shocked as our Gingerbread Man had run away. We have been enjoying making Wanted Posters and setting traps to try and find him again.

In Numeracy, we have been building on our knowledge of visualising from different perspectives and have been learning how to verbalise this by describing scenes using positional language. We have already been using simple positional language in earlier steps and have now begun to build on this by using more complex scenarios. We have been describing scenarios such as the journeys of a small-world character in more depth. We have been describing our route-finding spatial awareness in more detail. The children have been asked questions such as 'Is the lion in front of or behind the bear?' We have practised using stem sentences such as 'I have put the dog next to the cat' and 'The strawberry is positioned in between the apples.' Reading stories such as 'We're going on a bear hunt' will help to develop your child's use of positional language.



Earlier in the week we enjoyed a brilliant day at The Forgotten Forest. We loved sharing the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, making dens, being brave on the rope swing, exploring with natural crafts, tree climbing, planting, relaxing in the hammock and much more. We particularly enjoyed drinking our hot chocolates and toasting marshmallows on the campfire.

This weeks' word of the week is: Exploring



As part of our Enquiry Learning this week, we have enjoyed activities linked to our visit to the Forgotten Forest. We discussed our favourite parts of the day, looked at and talked about all the photographs we had taken, wrote about some of the activities that we enjoyed the most and created our own pictures using different media.
