## **Reception Newsletter**

Dear Parents/Carers,

In Literacy this week, we have learnt the sounds **v**, **w**, **x** and **y**. We have learnt to read and spell words such as **yum**, **van**, **win** and **fox**. We have learnt to read the tricky words: **has**, **his** and **her** and recapped the tricky words taught so far.

Once your child begins to develop in confidence at the skill of blending, they will be given a book to read at home. This book is fully decodable and can be used to practise the skill of blending the sounds together to help them read each word. They will also bring home a library book each Wednesday. This book is a book to share with an adult as they talk about the story, discuss what is happening in the pictures and make predictions about what might happen next. Reading and sharing both books at home will help them to work towards becoming a more fluent reader throughout the year. Please could your child's reading scheme book be returned in their plastic reading packet each day as these books are also shared at school. In Numeracy, the children have been introduced to the concept of one more and one less working with the numbers 1 - 5. We noticed that numbers and amounts increase in value when one more is added and decrease in value when one is taken away. The children were encouraged to answer and ask questions using mathematical vocabulary such as: How many? How many now? What is one more than? What is the number after? What is one less than? What is the number before?






Our topic work this week has focused on the story 'Funnybones' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. The children have enjoyed using chalk to draw skeletons. They have also used collage to create their own skeleton. We learnt about the different parts of our bodies, what they are called and what they are used for. We then labelled our favourite Funnybones characters using the chalks.
