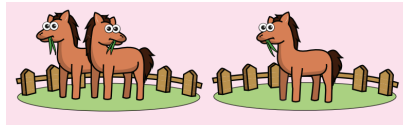


Dear Parents/Carers,

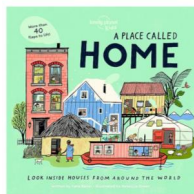
In Literacy this week, we have been learning the sounds **z**, **qu** and **ch**. We have learnt the tricky words **go**, **no**, **to**, and **into** and revised all the tricky words taught so far. We have also been continuing to encourage the children's skills in blending the sounds to read words using their word boxes, literacy based games and reading books. Please continue to practise blending sounds with your child, listening carefully for the words they can hear. Please ensure that you sign in your child's reading diary book once your child has completed their reading book at home and feel free to make any comments to let us know how they are doing with their reading at home. In our handwriting sessions this week we have been focusing on forming the letters r and n correctly. We will be repeating some of the letters that the children have already learnt to form. This will allow for lots of opportunities to practise the correct letter formation whilst saying the phrase to help them. Please encourage your child to keep practising their letter formation in their handwriting folders at home.

In Numeracy, the children have been introduced to the idea that all numbers are made up of smaller numbers, and these are referred to as the parts of the number. Learning to see a whole number and its parts at the same time is a key development in children's number understanding. This week we have been working practically to explore ways to partition a whole number, so they can find different parts which make the same whole. The children were asked key questions such as 'How many different ways can you make 1/2/3?' and 'Can you make the same number in a different way?' Next week we will be exploring 2D shape focusing on circles and triangles. We will be identifying, naming and comparing circles and triangles and looking for shapes in the environment. We will also be exploring and describing position.



During our topic sessions this week we have been learning about homes, looking at our own homes and looking at the similarities and differences between our own homes and homes in other countries around the world. The children then enjoyed creating their own homes using pictures and junk modelling resources, using different media and materials to fit them together.



We will use our enquiry afternoon sessions to explore the children's questions further. Please see the separate enquiry learning letter in your child's reading packet. During this topic, we will research further information, conduct exciting experiments, carry out investigations and learn more about the amazing wintry world around us.
