Dear Parents/Carers,

In Literacy this week, we have learnt the 'oo', 'oo', 'ar' and 'or' sounds. We learnt that the 'oo/oo' graphemes makes two sounds as in the words 'book' and 'boot.' We have revised the tricky words learnt so far and learnt the new tricky words 'was,' 'you' and 'they.' Please keep practising these at home with your child, little and often is always best. Next week in class, we will be learning more two-letter sounds and some more new tricky words. The sounds with two or three letters are difficult for the children to remember so any extra practice with their sound books will be very beneficial. This week we have been practising forming the letters **g** and **qu** using the letter formation phrases below to help them.






Round the goat's face and curl under its chin.

Round the queen's face, up to her crown, down her robe and a flick at the end.

In Maths this week, we have been learning about the composition of numbers up to 5. We have been using both our counting and subitising skills as a way of checking the different representations. The children have been continuing to develop their understanding of all numbers being made up of smaller numbers. We asked the children questions such as 'What do you see?' 'How do you see it?' 'What is the whole?' and 'What is the part?'



During our topic work, 'The World of Wonder-Wintry Worlds', we have been learning about Antarctica and penguins. We then researched facts about Antarctica and found animals that live there as well as penguins. Next week we will be learning all about Chinese New Year.




Word of the Week: Antarctica
