


In Literacy this week, we have been practising spelling and writing words containing the two and three letter sounds. We have also been writing captions and sentences remembering to use a capital letter at the beginning, finger spaces between each word and a full stop at the end. We have been continuing our learning on the suffixes 's' and 'es,' reading words such as 'speeches', 'paints' and 'splashes' etc. In our handwriting sessions we have been practising forming the capital letters 'X' and 'K.'



In Numeracy, we have been building on our knowledge of visualising from different perspectives and have been learning how to verbalise this by describing scenes using positional language. We have already been using simple positional language in earlier steps and have now begun to build on this by using more complex scenarios. We have been describing scenarios such as the journeys of a small-world character in more depth. We have been describing our route-finding spatial awareness in more detail. The children have been asked questions such as 'Is the lion in front of or behind the bear?' We have practised using stem sentences such as 'I have put the dog next to the cat' and 'The strawberry is positioned in between the apples.' Reading stories such as 'We're going on a bear hunt' will help to develop your child's use of positional language.



As part of our enquiry learning this week, we have been learning all about the different amazing animals and learnt about how they make adaptations to survive in the wild and how they are similar and different to animals that live in captivity. We have enjoyed making our favourite amazing animals using various media and materials.
