


This week's focus: Year 2 Common Exception Words

In English this week, we have decided to write our own postcards from the point of view of Woody, the Woodhouse mascot. At first, we decided that Woody should travel to the Amazon rainforest and then we all got to decide where Woody could go next and write a postcard from that place. Some pupils chose some extravagant and exciting places which it sounds like Woody has thoroughly enjoyed.

In Maths, we have used shapes to show that $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{2}{4}$ are **equivalent fractions**. We learnt that this fancy sounding term just means that they are **equal**. We showed that even though they have a different number of parts altogether and a different number of parts are shaded out of the whole, the fractions are identical.



We also learnt the skill of counting in halves and used it to work out total amounts. Can you count in wholes and halves to work out how many apples there are in the picture below?



Our **top tip** for questions like this is to count the whole objects first then count on in halves!
