

In English this week, we have introduced our new unit based on information text. We are reading a text called 'All About Witches' and have started to look at features of an information text. The pupils have created their own witch and decided on its appearance, habitat and behaviour. We are excited to write about these in more detail next week.




In our Maths lessons this week, we have consolidated our understanding of adding 10 to a 2-digit number and even started to add multiples of 10 e.g. 57 + 30 = 87. We have also introduced children to the column method, which is a new method that will help them a lot with addition and subtraction throughout school. First, we used sticks and bricks, then counters before drawing the additions. We then learnt how to remove the scaffolds and had a go at just writing it in numbers. The children have done a fabulous job!

- 1. Number sentence
- 2. Write the first number
- 3. Write the second number
- 4. Symbol
- 5. Add the ones
- 6. Add the tens



We have also practised recalling number bonds to 10. This is an important basic skill that the children need to be able to answer with speed and accuracy. They have improved as the week has gone on and are becoming much more fluent with these number facts. Below is a website that the children are familiar with when practising their number bonds.
